A 55 years old homeless Rajendran collects waste material on the streets to resell them for his survival. He claims, he doesn't have any relatives or family members to support him. He walks many miles on the streets to gather little material. At the end of the day, the maximum amount he would earn would be INR.150/-. He spends the entire amount for alcohol and cigarette. What a meaningless life it is for him?



One day, while collecting waste materials in the junk of garbage, a broken Liquor bottle slit his toe. The blood gushed out non-stop. He just took a waste clothe from garbage and rolled around his wound. The unbearable pain was quenched with liquor. After few days, he went to the government hospital for a treatment, but he was too late for the treatment

and really no medication worked out. Within a week maggots started eating his wound and crippled his movement to one place. We can understand the end, who would come to support in such a worst condition? He should have given little care for his health too. Who is to be blamed for his life? I think himself, in later days no one could go near him because of bad smell from the rotten wound.



Like Rajendran many people die before their time on the streets. Therefore Snehan plans to start a mobile clinic for the homeless people, where qualified nurse with basic medicine go around treating such a patients.

This simple act generates income for the unemployed homeless, employment for women and support for the organization to meet the basic needs.



Today we have started new shop in the **Auroville area**. This is our first customer who bought our products with big smile on her face. She is Hama, very fond of our simple bag for the daily use. And moreover our bags are in affordable price range to every person.

BINDING THE WOUNDS OF THE NEGLECTED

Just one year back, I saw homeless man sitting on the side of the road with little wound on his left leg, no one to care about

him nor government hospital admitted him for the treatment. Little by little the wound became big with lots of maggots eating up his whole leg. In the later stage Snehan NGO intervened to help him but faced worst rejection from the government hospital, NGO's, police department, and finally he died unwillingly on the road like animal.

This incident motivated Anumuthu founder of Snehan, to go for nursing study. This little skill will be big support to Snehan NGO and its work. At present Snehan is supporting an old neglected woman on the street, who suffers with big wound in her right leg. A knife fell on her leg, cutting her skin with deep cut. Snehan is able to help her with little medication and daily dressing. Now her condition is stable, she is able to keep small steps. This wound would take at least three months to cure. Snehan would stand and support her during her recovery.



Like this grandma many suffer on the street for such, Snehan would stand with this kind of precious people and treat them to live to the fullest.
