Within few months of his son's marriage, Sundaram was corned at home, by this time Sundaram drained his strength, not able to work anymore, and moreover, his eyes became dim. The new

daughter-in-law could not accept him anymore at home. Conflict erupted within husband and wife, this made him uncomfortable for Sundaram, where he takes a challenging step to come out of the family and live on the street. Now, he lives on the street by means of charity from the public. Added to this he is an asthma patient. Snehan is happy to reach out and support physically, mentally, and medically. Like



The victim is the family woman and her kids. Who will take care of them?
